**About Somewhere In Time:** The town of New Richmond was founded on September 22, 1814 and laid upon two surveys. On June 3, 1778, David Jackson submitted a survey for 333 acres. Jacob Light later gained access to the ownership of the Jackson survey and laid out the original 85 acres which came to be known as the village of New Richmond. This survey contained 219 one-fourth acre lots with six streets of 60 feet in width and one street of 30 feet in width. The lots numbered 98 and 99 were set aside for public use and this area is where the Market Street school now stands. Robert Beal also filed a survey on June 3, 1778 and this land later became the property of General William Lytle, who conveyed 875 acres to Thomas Ashburn in 1813. With his property butted against New Richmond, Ashburn named his acreage Susanna, after his wife. In 1828 the General Assembly passed a special act which incorporated the two villages into that of New Richmond. In the village, only a pleasant stroll away from the scenic Ohio river, sits an elaborately decorated and enchanting bed and breakfast appropriately named, Somewhere in Time. Situated in the quiet town of New Richmond this bed and breakfast is still only 15 minutes from downtown Cincinnati.

The common areas of the house are outlined with painstakingly hand-carved woodwork and are stunning in their Victorian antiques and fixtures. Ideal for weekend get-a-ways, and a wonderful alternative for the business traveler, Somewhere in Time will leave you feeling relaxed and pampered, ready to re-enter the real world with memories that last forever and a smile that should last for weeks.
